

One final word: it's the end of a remarkable year for Brock, with investment in the ground alongside improvements in the playing squad. The toilets are now completed, including the new disabled toilet, and work is continuing to sort out the floodlights (phew) – thanks to the Committee and all those who have worked so hard to make this happen. A decent ground, fit for a decent team – job done.

So – let's enjoy the derby, one final home game of 2025 – up the Badgers!



CLUB HISTORY 1898-2025

The club was founded in 1898, initially playing close to the Rhinefield Ornamental Drive. The Badgers were founder members of the New Forest League which they won a number of times. They moved before World War 1 to a site between the Rose and Crown and Snakemaster pubs. Following the war the club played in both the Bournemouth and Hampshire leagues, moving to Farnhamfield. In 1931 they were forced to move again, to Black Knoll when Farnhamfield was given over to housing. In 1935 the club won the New Forest Lads Cup. Within two years the Badgers moved to Oberfield and after World War 2 they spent some seasons at Tile Barn before moving to their current home at Grigg Lane in 1951.

The club were crowned Hampshire League Division Three champions in 1960 as well as winning the Bournemouth Seniors cup. They moved between the Second and Third divisions until in 1971 they were promoted to Division One where they won the league title in the 1975-76 season. Brockenhurst were founder members of the Wessex League, joining in 1986. The club's FA Cup giant killing reached its pinnacle in season 2001/02 when Kingstonian were defeated and in season 2004/05 the club reached the 3rd qualifying round, the run ending in defeat to Bath City.

In season 2012/13 the club returned to the Wessex Premier Division as Division One champions and reached the final of both the Southampton DFA Senior Cup and the Wessex League Cup. The Badgers won three cups in three years—in season 2019/20 the team won the Bournemouth Senior Cup; in 2020/21 we lifted the Hampshire Senior Invitational Supplementary Cup; and in 2021/22 we won the Russell-Cotes Cup. In 2020/21, both the U18 and U17 teams won their divisions. Season 2021/22 was one of the most successful for Brockenhurst in recent years, with the club finishing 6th in the Premier Division, getting to the last 16 in the FA Vase and winning the Russell-Cotes Cup. Brockenhurst celebrated its 125th season in 2023/24, and missed out on the promotion playoffs by goal difference only. At the end of the season, long-serving manager Pat McManus left the club; a successful and enjoyable testimonial match was held for Pat in July 2024.

We recently appointed Steve Devlin as first-team manager of Brockenhurst. We have retained the core of the squad from last year's campaign, and added experience, some returning players and a number of promising players. The future looks bright for The Badgers.



NEW MILTON TOWN CLUB HISTORY

The club was established in 1998 under the name Lymington & New Milton as a merger of AFC Lymington from the Wessex League and New Milton Town from Division Two of the Hampshire League, with the new club playing at New Milton Town's Fawcetts Field ground. The amalgamation of the two clubs also led to the formation of Lymington Town, who entered Division Three of the Hampshire League, and a new, New Milton club based in Milford-on-Sea, who joined Division Two for a single season before folding. In their first season, Lymington & New Milton retained the Wessex League title won by AFC Lymington in 1997/98. However, they were unable to take promotion as their ground failed to meet the requirements. They were runners-up in the league in each of the next two seasons, making another failed application for promotion in 1999/20.

In 2003/04 Lymington & New Milton were Wessex League champions, earning promotion to Division One of the Isthmian League. However, after a single season in the Isthmian League, they were transferred to Division One South & West of the Southern League. Despite finishing above the relegation zone in 2006/07, the club resigned from the league at the end of the season. Dropping back into the Premier Division of the Wessex League, the club were renamed New Milton Town. In 2012/13 they finished bottom of the Premier Division and were relegated to Division One. The following four seasons saw New Milton Town struggle to enter the top half of the table.

Lou Fern became Chairman at the start of the 2018/19 season and aimed to improve the club's professionalism. While off-pitch matters improved, on-pitch results did not, leading to frequent changes in management, but no one making a real improvement until the appointment of Paul Turner from Poole Town FC in 2020/21, although the season was curtailed due to the pandemic.

With 2021/22 back to normal, the club had a cracking season with a 9th place finish in the league & a run to the 4th round in the FA Vase, losing to Brockenhurst, from the division above, in front of 952 people.

The 2022/23 season brought a new Stadium sponsor, DMW Glazing, into the New Milton Town family and the club had another strong campaign, narrowly missing out on promotion. Finishing 3rd in the league, they then lost 2-4 on penalties in the play offs at home against Petersfield Town, with 544 spectators in attendance.

The 2023/24 season saw significant challenges for the club, with a very poor run of only 3 points in 20 games. The season ended in stark contrast to the previous one, with New Milton Town finishing 3rd from bottom, just narrowly avoiding relegation.

The club gained promotion back to the Wessex Premier Division at the end of the 2024/25 season under the new Chairman Dan Wills, from DMW Glazing.



MID-SEASON REVIEW

In my season preview, I said: "the Badgers should really be looking towards the top half and, who knows, the outside chance of a playoff spot? Ask me again December!". Even recognising the inevitable churn of players at this level, it felt like we had the bones of a very solid team. Of course I didn't know that Danny Ackland would be gone after matchday three... by which time we would have no points ... Anyway, it's December, so what do we make of it so far? In short: pretty good. Played 19, points 32. On past evidence, minimum 66 will be required for the playoffs and more likely 70+, but on recent form that's not out of the question. Devs has been manager for 23 games, won 15 and only lost 4 (which include the first two!). Visually, a team transformed – Jordi a rock in goal, Liam and Marce have been excellent at centre half... I could go on through the team but that would take all night, so I'm just going to pause for a moment on the joy of watching Freddie ripping teams apart, and the energy and football intelligence of our Tobys in the middle of the park. Harsh on everyone I haven't mentioned because this is a team game, and it's the team which is performing rather than individuals. Dylan is top scorer, while Connor has almost a goal a game. I'm not awarding my Player of the Half-Season, but it's great that there would be several in the argument for this. Devs has set this team up to play in a way that suits them and he's demanding more – and they're also demanding more of one another – which is one of the things I found so frustrating last season. At the midway point of our season, we're 5th; there are teams with games in hand but we're second in the form table, so dreams are allowed. Whether promotion is a sensible dream is a different matter – but what's the point of playing in the league pyramid if you're not aspiring to be the best you can be? We're also into the League Cup quarter-finals and, for a second successive season, into the semis of the Southampton Senior Cup. So how about seeing those Badgers at St Mary's huh, wouldn't that be something? So, 19 down and 19 to go. Looking up, not down. Let's keep this momentum going and see where it takes us! Season's Greetings to all Badgers, and Badgers fans, everywhere.





LAST TIME OUT ...

**JON RENYARD'S REPORT ON BROCKENHURST
V BEMERTON HEATH HARLEQUINS
20 DECEMBER 2025**

The game took place on a proper winter pitch – playable but heavy, not made for flowing football – all the more credit to the Badgers, therefore, that they played some sparkling stuff, especially in a first half which effectively decided the game. Brock were in front on 7 minutes: good move down the left, superb cross from Speechley-Price, converted by Connor Dunesby-Bent inside the six-yard box. Five minutes later and it was 2-0, super pass slipped through to Bent who turned provider, crossing to give Freddie Beale a tap-in at the back post. The game was then interrupted because of what looked a serious injury to Jordan Matthews – nobody near him, looked like he got his studs caught in the turf, wish him a speedy recovery. Another fizzing Bent cross through the box with nobody quite able to get a touch, but 24 minutes, Brock corner taken by Dukes, headed in by Bent. All too comfortable, and Brock were possibly a bit casual – one long ball allowed to bounce between two defenders and Griffiths, Harlequins' best player all afternoon, was clean through on goal, but Valero made an important save. And things went from bad to worse for the visitors: the Brock press forced a hurried pass back to keeper Dillon who misjudged the bounce and miskicked horribly, the ball slicing almost straight up in the air and giving Speechley-Price a simple volley into an empty net. And then right on half-time, Henry Brooks picked the ball up inside his own half, ran forward, ran through two challenges and found himself clean through... and finished calmly. HT 5-0

Unsurprisingly, after such an eventful first half, the second didn't quite match up. Bemerton made a couple of changes and that added energy, but Brock were also content to sit back and soak up what pressure there was... Griffiths dragged a shot wide of the far post... Torniainen had to deflect a deep cross behind for a corner... and then the Badgers woke up on 72 minutes, Beale whistling a shot just past the post and then just failing to get a touch to a wicked Speechley-Price cross at the back post. But finally, with seven minutes left, Omarion Mason converted neatly at the near post to add a sixth, and two seconds into overtime Brooks picked up the ball in his own half – again! – broke through a challenge and raced down the right, weaved inside and smashed home off the underside of the bar to round things off. 




