WELCOME FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Welcome to the Meadens Škoda Arena, Grigg Lane, for this evening's Wessex Premier Division fixture with Sturminster Newton Utd to whom we extend our thanks for agreeing to this rearranged date owing to the installation of our new floodlights. Fixtures come thick and fast this time of year and I am reminded that our small team of volunteers frequently go above and beyond the call of duty to ensure the ground is ready and matches are played without a hitch. As always my thanks go out to you all!

With the new floodlight installation drawing to a close the committee are turning our attention to the next projects on our priority list.

Following the recent FA ground safety review I recently spent a morning with the FA ground grading officer and representative from the Premier League Stadium Fund (PLSF) at Grigg Lane reviewing the results of the report compiled by their appointed consultants. While the ground scored highly in most areas we will, unsurprisingly, be required to mitigate risk by installing padding on the stand wall adjacent to the pitch. It transpires that specialist sports padding is not cheap! Fortunately, I am pleased to report that this work will be 100% funded by a PLSF grant (new money specifically provided for the safety review) for which we have begun the process of securing a quote and applying. The work will be undertaken as soon as possible

during the football season, however, we do not anticipate any disruption to football fixtures. Beyond padding the stand we continue to progress the projects on our infrastructure plan as funds allow. Next up is a kitchen in the clubhouse for which funds have been set aside to make a start this side of Christmas.

A reminder that the ExSaints will be returning on Friday 25th September for a rematch with the Brock Legends following last year's exciting 5-5 draw. Last year attracted a crowd of 800 who enjoyed a great night out raising much needed funds for Brockenhurst Youth football and Saints good causes. Tickets will be available for advanced purchase on the club website or on the gate at £10 for adults, £5 for kids and concessions again this year. Come and enjoy the fun!

Sturminster have made a strong start to their Wessex League campaign and we can anticipate another tough game tonight. A win would see us back near the top of the table and while the season is still young it is important that we build some momentum and remain in contention if our aspirations of an elusive playoff spot are to be realised. So let's get behind the team, back the boys and make some noise.

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CLUB HISTORY 1898-2026

The club was founded in 1898, initially playing close to the Rhinefield Ornamental Drive. The Badgers were founder members of the New Forest League which they won a number of times. They moved before World War 1 to a site between the Rose and Crown and Snakecatcher pubs. Following the war the club played in both the Bournemouth and Hampshire leagues, moving to Fathersonfield. In 1931 they were forced to move again, to Black Knoll when Fathersonfield was given over to housing. In 1935 the club won the New Forest Lads Cup. Within two years the Badgers moved to Oberfield and after World War 2 they spent some seasons at Tile Barn before moving to their current home at Grigg Lane in 1951.

The club were crowned Hampshire League Division Three champions in 1960 as well as winning the Bournemouth Seniors cup. They moved between the Second and Third divisions until in 1971 they were promoted to Division One where they won the league title in the 1975-76 season.

Brockenhurst were founder members of the Wessex League, joining in 1986. The club's FA Cup giant killing reached its pinnacle in season 2001/02 when Kingstonsian were defeated and in season 2004/05 the club reached the 3rd qualifying round, the run ending in defeat to Bath City.

In season 2012/13 the club returned to the Wessex Premier Division as Division One champions and reached the final of both the Southampton DFA Senior Cup and the Wessex League Cup. The Badgers won three cups in three years—in season 2019/20 the team won the Bournemouth Senior Cup; in 2020/21 we lifted the Hampshire Senior Invitational Supplementary Cup; and in 2021/22 we won the Russell-Cotes Cup. In 2020/21, both the U18 and U17 teams won their divisions.

Season 2021/22 was one of the most successful for Brockenhurst in recent years, with the club finishing 6th in the Premier Division, getting to the last 16 in the FA Vase and winning the Russell-Cotes Cup. Brockenhurst celebrated its 125th season in 2023/24, and missed out on the promotion playoffs by goal difference only. At the end of the season, long-serving manager Pat McManus left the club; a successful and enjoyable testimonial match was held for Pat in July 2024.

Steve Devlin became our first-team manager near the beginning of season 2025/26. This season, we have retained the core of the squad from last year's campaign, and added experience, some returning players and a number of promising players. The future looks bright for The Badgers.



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STURMINSTER NEWTON UNITED CLUB HISTORY

In 1874 the club, which was then known as the Panthers FC, became the first ever club from the West Country to participate in the FA Cup, reaching the second round on three occasions. In 1877-78 they played the legendary Wanderers in the first round but lost 9-1.

In the 1890's their name was changed to Sturminster St Mary's, with the current name adopted in 1945.

They were among the founding members of the Dorset Combination in 1957, having previously played in the Dorset League. After leaving the league due to financial difficulties in 1960, they played in the lower Dorset Senior League until they re-joined the Combination in 1972. They remained in that competition (since 2002 known as the Dorset Premier League) until 2011, when they were relegated to the Dorset Senior League. During this time, they won the Combination Cup twice, in 1981 and 1995.

They moved from a public recreation ground to their own stadium in Honeymead Lane in 1996.

In 2011-12 under Gary Head, in his first full season in charge, the club won the Dorset Senior Trophy with a 1-0 win over Parley Sports at Wimborne Town.

In 2021-22 under the management of Nick Squires the club won its second Dorset Senior Trophy, beating Merley Cobham Sports 2-1 at The County Ground, Hamworthy.

In 2022-23 the club continued their success adding the Dorset Premier League Cup to the trophy cabinet beating Sturminster Marshall 4-1 at Wimborne Town.

The 2023-24 season has been the most successful in the clubs history as they have won the Dorset Premier League for the first time and have gained promotion to Step 6.

The 2024-2025 season exceeded our wildest dreams. Although not everything went our way on the pitch, overall it was a terrific season with manager Nick Squires leading the club to eighth position just a few points behind the play off places. Our reserves reached the Dorset League's Division 2/3 cup final but lost out to Bourne-mouth Electric.

Then came the 2025-2026 season! We started off well leading the division for the first few weeks but were overtaken by Devizes Town. We remained in the or around the play-off positions and kept the pressure on the other teams eventually returning to the top spot when Devizes had a bad run.

A few results that unexpectedly went against us meant that we ended up a very close and credible second to Devizes Town. The play-offs awaited us - a well fought 0-0 draw at home to Bristol Telephones (where we won on penalties) and then a 2-2 draw at home in the final against Wells City which again we managed to win on penalties saw us promoted to step 5 for the first time in the club's history.

For 2026-2027 we say goodbye and a hearty thanks to the Western League as we move laterally to the Wessex League Premier Division to start our new adventure.

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LAST TIME OUT ...

FRIMLEY GREEN V BROCKENHURST—FA VASE

The neutrals will look at the result and think: yes, Premier Division having a bit more than Division One. And maybe that's as good a summary as any. Brock were the better side, reasonably comfortable throughout the game, didn't really get near to top gear but didn't need to. Chika Ugwumba was lively from the start – an early cross sliced behind; and on 14 minutes the opening goal, played in neatly by Harry McGrath and Ugwumba needed no second bidding, running on into the box and converting. Frimley had already had what ultimately turned out to be their best chance – Lacey awarded a soft free kick 20 yards out, took it himself but hit it straight at Stainer-Reid. But Brock were having the lion's share of possession and territory – Ugwumba with a shot just wide, and then the second goal, corner from Bailey, Colmer's shot well blocked but Elliot Wells ready to smash the rebound home. That gave the Badgers a cushion and they should probably have extended the lead before the break – Colmer with a flick-header just over the bar from a corner, then with a piledriver from 25 yards which didn't miss by much, and then another header over the bar from a corner. Josh Bullen did have a shot for the hosts during overtime, superbly blocked by Giles. HT 0-2

The second half didn't bring a glut of goalmouth action as the Badgers kept their discipline and looked to manage the game. They might have added a quick third when Bailey found Sami Makhloufi, whose shot went just wide; the Green didn't create much, although Bullen did play a super cross through the six-yard box, touched by nobody... and 67 minutes, another Brock corner from Bailey, Rian Drake arriving at the back post to hammer the ball in from about two yards. The hosts didn't give up, but their tactic of long balls towards their front line foundered on the excellent Brock defence... 10 minutes to go, sub Cartwright looped a shot over the bar... at the other end, Aga-In and Makhloufi combined cleverly a couple of times without creating a clear opening. Five to go and the ball somehow broke free to Freddie Bullard, 35 yards from goal but in splendid isolation... but two defenders got back comfortably to tackle him before he reached the area. It made no difference; the Badgers were through. FT 0-3

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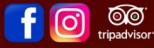
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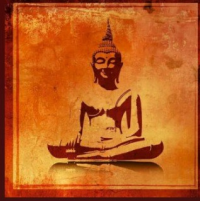
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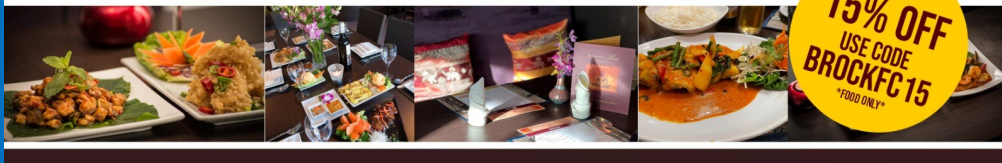
