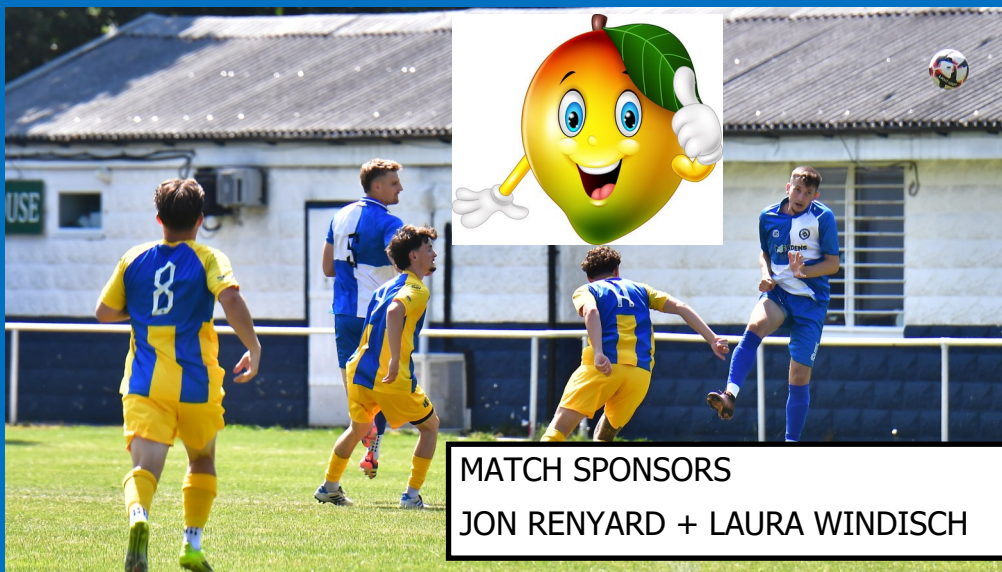

WELCOME FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Good Evening and welcome to The Meadens Skoda Arena, Grigg Lane, for our first home Wessex Premier Division game of the season against Hamworthy Recreation.

I would like to begin by thanking our tireless team of volunteers for all their efforts preparing the pitch for the start of the new season. The dry summer has made life challenging to say the least. To present the pitch in such good condition is a real testament to their hard work and commitment ... great job guys!

In addition to the usual off-season works, and thanks to further support from donors, we have also completed drainage works at both ends of the pitch in and around the goal areas. Fingers crossed; this will hopefully result in both an improved playing surface and ensure more games can go ahead in wet weather.

After two years as Club Secretary these are my first programme notes since taking over as Chairman at the recent AGM. Having seen first hand the amount of time and effort my predecessor and good friend, Mark Böckle, put into the role it is something I take on with excitement and trepidation in equal measures. Under Mark's guidance the club moved forward tremendously over the last two years. We believe our operating model and plans are sound. I look forward to continuing the good work and providing future updates. Mark remains on the committee and his help will be invaluable. Thank you Mark for all you have done and continue to do for the club!

The long awaited replacement floodlights, funded through a Premier League Stadium Fund grant kindly supported by a donation from the club's investors, are finally underway. FA approved contractors Halliday Lighting have

completed all their preliminary tasks and the new floodlights will be installed imminently.

There have been a number of changes on the club committee over the summer not least the creation of the new position of Head of Football which I am delighted has been taken on by long term friend and supporter of the Badgers, Stan Reid. Stan will oversee the day-to-day running of football freeing up my time to focus on our plans to further develop the club as a whole. I look forward to working closely with Stan who will provide a more detailed update on all things football in our next match day programme.

The Badgers have made a strong start to their campaign with an opening away win in the league on "the island" at Cowes followed by an outstanding performance in an exciting 3-5 away win in the league cup at Hamble last Tuesday; somewhere the Badgers rarely get a result.

As I write these notes the team are preparing for a third away fixture on the bounce at Badshot Lea on Saturday (8th August) in the first preliminary round of the FA Cup. Starting the season with three consecutive away fixtures has been a tall order and it will be great to finally get things underway at Grigg Lane tonight.

This early it can be tricky to know what to expect from our opponents as teams settle into the new season. One thing for certain is there are no easy games in the Wessex Prem and we anticipate a stern test from Hamworthy tonight. The Badgers have hit their stride early but will need to be at the races from the start tonight so let's get behind them from the first whistle.

There is a real buzz around the club and I look forward to providing more insights in future programme notes.

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CLUB HISTORY 1898-2026

The club was founded in 1898, initially playing close to the Rhinefield Ornamental Drive. The Badgers were founder members of the New Forest League which they won a number of times. They moved before World War 1 to a site between the Rose and Crown and Snakecatcher pubs. Following the war the club played in both the Bournemouth and Hampshire leagues, moving to Fathersonfield. In 1931 they were forced to move again, to Black Knoll when Fathersonfield was given over to housing. In 1935 the club won the New Forest Lads Cup. Within two years the Badgers moved to Oberfield and after World War 2 they spent some seasons at Tile Barn before moving to their current home at Grigg Lane in 1951.

The club were crowned Hampshire League Division Three champions in 1960 as well as winning the Bournemouth Seniors cup. They moved between the Second and Third divisions until in 1971 they were promoted to Division One where they won the league title in the 1975-76 season.

Brockenhurst were founder members of the Wessex League, joining in 1986. The club's FA Cup giant killing reached its pinnacle in season 2001/02 when Kingstonsian were defeated and in season 2004/05 the club reached the 3rd qualifying round, the run ending in defeat to Bath City.

In season 2012/13 the club returned to the Wessex Premier Division as Division One champions and reached the final of both the Southampton DFA Senior Cup and the Wessex League Cup. The Badgers won three cups in three years—in season 2019/20 the team won the Bournemouth Senior Cup; in 2020/21 we lifted the Hampshire Senior Invitational Supplementary Cup; and in 2021/22 we won the Russell-Cotes Cup. In 2020/21, both the U18 and U17 teams won their divisions.

Season 2021/22 was one of the most successful for Brockenhurst in recent years, with the club finishing 6th in the Premier Division, getting to the last 16 in the FA Vase and winning the Russell-Cotes Cup. Brockenhurst celebrated its 125th season in 2023/24, and missed out on the promotion playoffs by goal difference only. At the end of the season, long-serving manager Pat McManus left the club; a successful and enjoyable testimonial match was held for Pat in July 2024.

Steve Devlin became our first-team manager near the beginning of season 2025/26. This season, we have retained the core of the squad from last year's campaign, and added experience, some returning players and a number of promising players. The future looks bright for The Badgers.

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HAMWORTHY RECREATION CLUB HISTORY

Hamworthy Recreation Football Club was formed in 1948 as Hamworthy Engineering FC and played on the Sports Ground opposite the factory at Fleetsbridge in Poole (where the Tesco supermarket now stands). When the site at Fleetsbridge was sold to Tesco in the late 1980's the football, along with the Sports & Social Club, moved to its current home at Magna Road.

At that time 'Hamworthy Engineering FC' were playing in the Bournemouth League (Division 1). The Club won the Bournemouth Senior Cup in the 1988/89 season, and after winning the Division One Championship in 1991/92 'The Rec' successfully applied to join the Dorset Combination League for season 92/93 when they finished 3rd. Success soon followed when the Club won a hat-trick of Combination League Championships in 1993/94, 1994/95 and 1995/96.

'The Rec' have lifted the League Championship Trophy on another nine occasions, most recently in 2021/2022.

The Club have won the League Cup on six occasions.

'The Rec' consider that their greatest achievement was in 1995, when not only did they win the League Championship, they also won the Dorset Senior Cup, defeating Weymouth Football Club from the Southern League 3-0 at Magna Road in the Semi-Final, and Poole Town FC, another Southern League team, 4-1 in the final.

The 2001/01 season saw the Club change its name to Hamworthy Recreation FC to reflect the name of their current headquarters. Our proud boast – we've never finished below 6th since Hamworthy Engineering joined the Combination in 1992/93.

During 2022 and 2024, with funding support from the Football Foundation and local sponsors' we managed to get the ground upgraded to have floodlights and a 100 Seat Stand and so have progressed to the Wessex Premier League. We have a Reserve Team, both as a feeder team from our Under 18's and upwards towards our First team.

We now have the following teams and Leagues:

- First Team in the Premier League of the Wessex League

- Reserves in the Dorset Premier League

- Under 18 Team who play in the Dorset Football League U18s Division 1

There has been a change of name for our home venue. On 3rd August 2026 the Hamworthy Club changed its name to Canford Magna Complex but we remain as Hamworthy Recreation FC for all three teams.

HAMBLE CLUB V BROCKENHURST

HAMPSHIRE SENIOR CUP PRELIMINARY ROUND

The evening started in the worst possible fashion for Brock, 3 minutes, rookie keeper Graydon with a poor clearance straight to Barrow, 25 yards out, who simply looped the ball back over him into the net to give the Monks an early lead. Brock weren't sitting back, driven forward by Toby Bailey with a commanding captain's performance. 7 minutes: a neat move and a cross from Palmier, which fell kindly for Henry Brooks on the right side of the box and he powered the ball in to equalise. All action: back came Hamble, Mason forcing a decent save from Graydon, but on 12 minutes Hamble were back in front. A corner taken by Barrow, swung in towards the near post, deflected in off someone in blue. Brock levelled against after a really classy move finished by Harry McGrath finding the far corner, and on 33 he gave Brock an unexpected lead. 2-3... four minutes later, all square again, this time a corner reaching Matt Casey who did well to control the bouncing ball before turning and hooking beyond Graydon. HT 3-3

Fewer goals in the second half, to be sure, but probably more chances or at least half-chances. The first meaningful effort came from Casey after an uncertain clearance from Graydon reached him about 30 yards out but on the angle – his effort was on target but the keeper got back across to scramble the ball away... but on 55, Brock were ahead again, a fine shot lashed home from the angle from Dylan Walker. And four minutes later, a cushion for the Badgers, another classy move set Brooks through to score his second and make it 3-5. The hosts looked dangerous at every set piece, with Dan Bradford blocking or heading pretty much every chance away... Mazi set up Mason with a great chance which came back off the inside of the post. Brock weren't just sitting back in the face of the Hamble storm – sub Toby Colmer with a shot well turned away by Doe... then Walker placed his shot just wide of the post. Doe then made two absolutely blinding saves... McGrath pulled a shot cross goal and narrowly wide... finally the Monks with a succession of corners, mostly blocked by Bradford and five minutes into overtime he headed one away brilliantly from right under his own crossbar... but that was time and the win was secure. FT 3-5

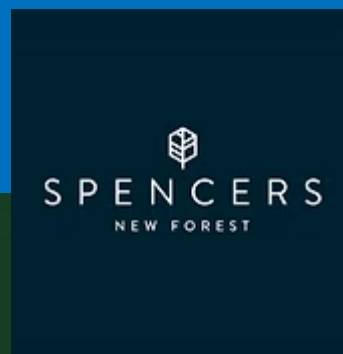

CASSIUS NEWTON

It is with great sadness that we report the death of our former player, Cassius ("Cass") Newton.

Cass made over 100 appearances for the Badgers between 2014 and 2023, and featured in Pat McManus' testimonial game in 2024.

My strong memory of Cass was at our League match against Fareham Town in March 2020. During the game he was tackled, received some treatment on the pitch, hobbled off, and then tried to restart. However he was unable to "run it off" as his leg was in fact broken!

Off the pitch Cass was very well-liked for his considerate approach and his generous nature.

Jon Renyard our match reporter writes: "I have several memories of Cass but the one which stands out is away to Moneyfields (played at Havant and Waterlooville) on 23 February 2023. I remember Cass because he scored our first goal – the first goal of the game indeed – but Brock went on to concede six, having been largely outplayed. And then in injury time, astonishingly, the Badgers got a second. My report from that game notes: "Entertainingly, the Moneys defence were furious about this. Lads, you're 6-2 up in injury time... I respect pride in performance, but really? You're not even defending a clean sheet. Maybe they lose a percentage of their match fee for every goal conceded." And when I think of Cass, it's that game that I remember."

Brockenhurst FC expresses its condolences to Cass' family and loved ones.

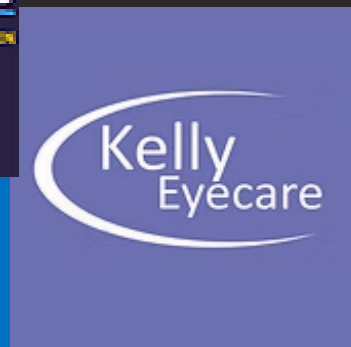
