

VIEW FROM THE FOOTBALL SECRETARY

Firstly a Happy New Year to everyone, plus a warm welcome to the team, officials and supporters of Andover New Street and today's match officials. My last programme notes were done in September 2025 when it was all doom and gloom, so I am happy to report on the dramatic change of results, fortune and personnel rounding off the year in style for the Badgers.

Our 1st team were sat bottom of the division after 4 matches and now under the management of Steve Devlin sit proudly in 5th place, we are in the Quarter Final of the Wessex League Cup and in the Semi Final of the Southampton Senior Cup. Steve has only tasted defeat twice in all that time, once in the League at Portland and to AFC Stoneham in the Russell-Cotes Cup. We also lost to Millbrook when Steve was celebrating his 40th birthday (so he's excused from that result in the archives). After a number of postponements, with only three games played since the beginning of the year, we find other teams catching up with us in terms of number of games played. Our most recent match, last Tuesday evening, saw us take a point at AFC Stoneham, which only one other club has equalled this season.

Our U18's had a good start, tailed off in October, lost their Manager Dan Mawer and then Mike Wells stepped into his shoes and we have gone on a great unbeaten run, the team currently

sit second in the League. We are in the quarter-finals of the League Cup, away at Moneyfields on 22nd February. Also a big congratulations to 16-year old Esteban Batista who has made the step up from the U18, through the Development Squad and into our 1st team and doesn't look out of place. The club's Development side under Matt Walker's leadership currently sit mid-table.

With my match day and sponsorship hats on, if anyone can spare a few hours to assist at home matches we would welcome your time, even if it's putting on a steward's jacket to show a presence.



CLUB HISTORY 1898-2025

The club was founded in 1898, initially playing close to the Rhinefield Ornamental Drive. The Badgers were founder members of the New Forest League which they won a number of times. They moved before World War 1 to a site between the Rose and Crown and Snakemaster pubs. Following the war the club played in both the Bournemouth and Hampshire leagues, moving to Farnhamfield. In 1931 they were forced to move again, to Black Knoll when Farnhamfield was given over to housing. In 1935 the club won the New Forest Lads Cup. Within two years the Badgers moved to Oberfield and after World War 2 they spent some seasons at Tile Barn before moving to their current home at Grigg Lane in 1951.

The club were crowned Hampshire League Division Three champions in 1960 as well as winning the Bournemouth Seniors cup. They moved between the Second and Third divisions until in 1971 they were promoted to Division One where they won the league title in the 1975-76 season. Brockenhurst were founder members of the Wessex League, joining in 1986. The club's FA Cup giant killing reached its pinnacle in season 2001/02 when Kingstonian were defeated and in season 2004/05 the club reached the 3rd qualifying round, the run ending in defeat to Bath City.

In season 2012/13 the club returned to the Wessex Premier Division as Division One champions and reached the final of both the Southampton DFA Senior Cup and the Wessex League Cup. The Badgers won three cups in three years—in season 2019/20 the team won the Bournemouth Senior Cup; in 2020/21 we lifted the Hampshire Senior Invitational Supplementary Cup; and in 2021/22 we won the Russell-Cotes Cup. In 2020/21, both the U18 and U17 teams won their divisions. Season 2021/22 was one of the most successful for Brockenhurst in recent years, with the club finishing 6th in the Premier Division, getting to the last 16 in the FA Vase and winning the Russell-Cotes Cup. Brockenhurst celebrated its 125th season in 2023/24, and missed out on the promotion playoffs by goal difference only. At the end of the season, long-serving manager Pat McManus left the club; a successful and enjoyable testimonial match was held for Pat in July 2024.

We recently appointed Steve Devlin as first-team manager of Brockenhurst. We have retained the core of the squad from last year's campaign, and added experience, some returning players and a number of promising players. The future looks bright for The Badgers.

ANDOVER NEW STREET CLUB HISTORY

New Street Football Club was started in the early 1890's by the vicar of St. Mary's Church, Rev. (later Canon) E.R. Braithwaite. New Street in those times was the working-class part of Andover with the church and the large town houses of the middle classes at the top end, the Newbury Road turnpike at the bottom end and open fields on either side of its length. The team's first pitch was on Farmer Dance's field which is now called Dances Close off New Street. Rev. Braithwaite was looking for a way to keep the young men of New Street out of the several pubs, ale houses and bottle shops found there. He came up with the idea of a football team and the only qualification required was that the player had to live in New Street. The team was successful and lasted until the 1950's when unfortunately it folded but was resurrected in 1961. When the Wessex League was formed in 1986, several clubs left the Hampshire League and New Street were promoted to Division One.

They finished bottom of Division One in 1989-90 and were relegated to Division Two. The following season saw the club relegated again as they finished second-from-bottom of Division Two. However, they were Division Three runners-up in 1991-92 to secure an immediate promotion back to Division Two; this was followed by promotion back to Division One the following season.

New Street has had several homes over the years and moved to their present site at Foxcotte Park in 1992, the same year that New Street Youth F.C. came into existence.

Recognition of the club's commitment to the local community came when in April 2005 we were granted F.A. Charter Standard Community Club status the highest accolade a football club can achieve. In 2012 and 2016 we were named as Hampshire F.A.'s Community Club of the Year.

Andover New Street FC has a long history of providing football specifically for Girls with a Ladies' team starting in 1995. In 2012, Footy4Girls was created by Simon Dewhurst, a football group that was for any girl that wanted to play. The group grew steadily during 2012 with around ten 8-11 year olds attending on a regular basis. Footy4Girls has continued to grow with each week seeing 40 plus girls training and playing matches and four sides in the Winchester Leagues.

Always community-minded in 2005 a few of our coaches went into Icknield School for children with severe learning difficulties to run weekly coaching sessions. These were so enjoyable and successful that our inclusive group Streets Ahead was formed two years later to enable youngsters or adults with physical or learning difficulties, who love to play football, but are unable for a variety of reasons to take part in mainstream clubs, to participate in the game. 2 years ago Streets Ahead celebrated its 10th anniversary. The club now look forward to the challenges of the coming season in the Velocity Wessex League Premier Division.

LAST TIME OUT ...

AFC STONEHAM V BROCKENHURST

03 FEBRUARY 2026—BY JON RENYARD

An enthralling, unpredictable encounter, this, with six excellent goals, and ultimately the points shared. Games are often better after an early goal, and what a goal this was – Brock attacking down the right, the cross cleared back out again to Freddie Beale, 25 yards out and maybe 15 in from the goalline, and he smashed a perfect shot into the top corner, keeper no chance. You won't see a better strike anywhere in the Wessex this season, and Brock had a 3rd minute lead. The Purps continued to look vulnerable to the pace down the flanks but began to get more control of the ball; Martins and Sampson combining well, Badgers defence under pressure but holding firm. One clever cross from Lewis Nagle on 18 minutes, Martins with a great run in behind the defence but couldn't quite get a touch... another shot deflected just wide of the post... but the hosts were holding a high defensive line and Brock nearly exploited it on 23, excellent interception from Thomson – one minute later, Henry Brooks got clear down the right with a storming run, perfect cross to the back post, diverted home by Mitch Speechley-Price and the Badgers had a cushion. Ah, but Brock had poked the bear, and the bear awoke. Within two minutes, Tyrell Sampson went down the left, mazed his way past three defenders and calmly slotted into the far corner to reduce the deficit. Nagle then pulled a shot narrowly wide of the near post; and Marfarlane cleared a cross from his own goalline. Stoneham in the ascendant now and level on 33: a lovely incisive passing move, Mat Bainbridge arriving late to collect the ball near the penalty spot and score, Valero got a hand but not enough to stop the ball going over the line. The Badgers had chances to retake the lead: Miller misjudged a bouncing ball, Speechley-Price got beyond him but shot wide – quite a way out but a half-chance. And then keeper Callum Lee left his area but didn't get enough on his clearance, McCarthy-Gardiner near the touchline couldn't get his shot on target – to be fair there were defenders back. 44 minutes, another great Stoneham move: Sampson down the left, on to Martins, on again to Nagle arriving in the box – might have scored but instead one more pass to Alex Welch for a simple finish. Great goal; first-half turnaround complete. And still time for controversy. Brock bounced back, Beale on the run, Lee came to claim but caught the ball outside the box: free kick, nothing more. Only the ref knows why; and nobody knows what difference it would have made if Stoneham had been down to ten. The Badgers were frustrated, even more so when the resulting free kick was bundled home but disallowed for a foul in the box (I have it on good authority that this was the correct decision!). HT 3-2

There was little chance that the second would match the breathlessness of the first, but it started brightly – a couple of minutes in, Toby Colmer arriving at the edge of the box but his cross-shot went narrowly wide. But the Purps now had their rhythm, more familiar with the surface, anticipating both the bounce of the ball and the runs of their teammates: Brock had to dig in and hold firm. And, to be fair, they did – even surviving a sinbin for Toby Bailey during a period where the Badgers were getting the thin end of the refereeing decisions. Stoneham were looking for that decisive fourth – Martins rising high, 8 yards out, great downward header but even better diving save from Valero, pushing the ball away from danger. Another deep cross – just over the head of Sampson. A corner half-cleared and returned – Miller stretching for the header and putting it wide. Brock needed to make the most of their rare opportunities up the pitch – another great run from Brooks but the defence somehow scrambling the cross away. And just when it seemed that time would slip away, 88 minutes: a clever ball forward to sub Connor Dunesby-Bent who beat the offside trap, ran through on goal, lobbed the onrushing Lee and watched the ball bounce... against the far post... and in, and Brock had nicked a point. They might even have won it in overtime, Dunesby-Bent twisting past two defenders on the left but his shot was just deflected beyond the far post by Lee. FT 3-3
