

CLUB HISTORY 1898-2023

The club was founded in 1898, initially playing close to the Rhinefield Ornamental Drive. The Badgers were founder members of the New Forest League which they won a number of times. They moved before World War 1 to a site between the Rose and Crown and Snakecatcher pubs. Following the war the club played in both the Bournemouth and Hampshire leagues, moving to Fathersfield. In 1931 they were forced to move again, to Black Knoll when Fathersfield was given over to housing. In 1935 the club won the New Forest Lads Cup. Within two years the Badgers moved to Oberfield and after World War 2 they spent some seasons at Tile Barn before moving to their current home at Grigg Lane in 1951.

The club were crowned Hampshire League Division Three champions in 1960 as well as winning the Bournemouth Seniors cup. They moved between the Second and Third divisions until in 1971 they were promoted to Division One where they won the league title in the 1975-76 season. Brockenhurst were founder members of the Wessex League, joining in 1986. The club's FA Cup giant killing reached its pinnacle in season 2001/02 when Kingstonian were defeated and in season 2004/05 the club reached the 3rd qualifying round, the run ending in defeat to Bath City.

In season 2012/13 the club returned to the Wessex Premier Division as Division One champions and reached the final of both the Southampton DFA Senior Cup and the Wessex League Cup. The Badgers won three cups in three years—in season 2019/20 the team won the Bournemouth Senior Cup; in 2020/21 we lifted the Hampshire Senior Invitational Supplementary Cup; and in 2021/22 we won the Russell-Cotes Cup. In 2020/21, both the U18 and U17 teams won their divisions. Season 2021/22 was one of the most successful for Brockenhurst in recent years, with the club finishing 6th in the Premier Division, getting to the last 16 in the FA Vase and winning the Russell-Cotes Cup.

Brockenhurst celebrated its 125th season in 2023/24, and missed out on the promotion playoffs by goal difference only. At the end of the season, long-serving manager Pat McManus left the club; a successful and enjoyable testimonial match for Pat was held in July 2024.

Danny Ackland has now become the manager of Brockenhurst; we have retained many of the players from last year's positive campaign, and have made some great signings too. The future looks bright for The Badgers.

BOURNEMOUTH POPPIES CLUB HISTORY

THE STORY OF "THE POPPIES"

The club – initially named Bournemouth Rovers – was founded at a meeting presided over by Alderman J Nethercoate (later Mayor of Bournemouth) on 11 September 1875. It is one of the oldest clubs in the country being founder Members of the Football Association, the Hampshire FA and the Bournemouth FA. After a brief spell as Bournemouth Dean Park, the name Bournemouth FC was adopted in 1889 having amalgamated with another local side-Bournemouth Arabs. The club's nickname comes from the poppy red colour which was adopted in 1895/6.

The club was among founder members of the Hampshire League and up to joining the Wessex League in 1986 had played entirely in the Hampshire League, except for a short spell at the turn of the 20th century. Earliest record of playing in the FA Cup was a 6-0 defeat at Kennington Oval against Old Westminsters back on 1 November 1884, and the club played the second game in the inaugural Hampshire League campaign of 1896/97. The club has had three homes during its history - East Common near the Bournemouth railway station, Dean Park (current home of Dorset County Cricket) and now Victoria Park, which was formerly a farmer's field. The first taste of County success came in winning the West Division in 1905. Poppies became County Division Champions either side of the Great War, picking up the Hampshire League Shield in 1913, with Wheeler scoring 76 goals that season from 47 matches including 9 in a 19 day period. The furthest progress in the FA Amateur Cup came at that time as well, reaching the 3rd Round in 1923/24. In 1929 the club was relegated to Division 2 and there were only brief spells in the top flight until the club joined the newlyformed Wessex League in 1985.

The Wessex League Championship has remained elusive, coming close on two occasions with a 3rd place in 1990/91 under the guidance of Tommy Taylor and runners up spot in 1994/5 to Fleet Town when Alex Pike was the manager. The first piece of silverware for a number of years arrived in 2010/11, in the 25th Wessex League season, in the shape of the League Cup, with a 1-0 win over Winchester City. 2011/12 saw the team reach the FA Carlsberg Vase Quarter Final for the first time- going out to 0-2 in a home reverse against West Auckland Town.

The new clubhouse was opened in 1985—just in time for entering the Wessex League and the current 205-seater stand provides adequate cover from the elements with several rows of bench seating replacing the old wooden stand that was destroyed by fire during 1975. This stretches about a third of the length of the pitch—next to the glass-fronted clubhouse.

LAST TIME ROUND

JON RENYARD'S REVIEW OF BROCKENHURST POPPIES—15 AUGUST 2023

Brockenhurst 1 Bournemouth 2

These were two pretty evenly-matched teams, and the game was decided by the fact that Brock created chances but couldn't take them, while Poppies didn't create that much but were gifted two goals which they duly accepted and went home with the points. A frustrating evening for Badgers fans.

The first half of the game was quite watchable, without a great deal of goalmouth incident – half-chances created but neither goalkeeper called into serious action, although one swift Bournemouth attack resulted in Medcraff, formerly of this parish, shooting powerfully but just wide of the near post from the edge of the box. The Badgers made the breakthrough on the half-hour when Tom Sykes was fouled just inside the box, and Rossi made no mistake with the penalty, powerfully to keeper Lewiarz's right. Brock then briefly took the ascendency without creating a clear opening, although right on half-time, a Poppies attack and Medcraff turned and shot on the angle – powerful but just too high. HT 1-0 Poppies started the second half positively, but it was the Badgers who continued to create the clearest chances: a Pearce-Eavis header blocked on the line, a great run from sub Nixon but his cross went between the two Brock strikers, a header crashing back off the underside of the bar. another great run from Nixon but his shot on the angle was straight at Lewiarz. The best chance of all was probably on 65 minutes when a corner was recycled and Moore headed powerfully over from about 8 yards. Brock should have sealed the game in this period, they had the chances to put things to bed. Poppies were struggling to create much against a well-drilled defence, with the final ball not finding its man – the game was a bit scrappy, to be honest, too many hopeful long balls from both sides, and the ball spending too long in the air. The pendulum swung on 74 minutes; Pike was penalised for a high foot in the box, Medcraff converted the spot-kick, and the match was all square. 8 minutes from time, and the turnaround was complete. Sub Hansford won the ball in midfield and his shot from 25 yards didn't look the best, but it caught Mayo too far off his line – and that was that. Brock didn't seriously threaten an equaliser, although Philpott did have one shot tipped over for a corner. Only 90 seconds of injury time, despite all the second-half subs! FT 1-2


