CLUB HISTORY 1898-2025

The club was founded in 1898, initially playing close to the Rhinefield Ornamental Drive. The Badgers were founder members of the New Forest League which they won a number of times. They moved before World War 1 to a site between the Rose and Crown and Snakecatcher pubs. Following the war the club played in both the Bournemouth and Hampshire leagues, moving to Fathersfield. In 1931 they were forced to move again, to Black Knoll when Fathersfield was given over to housing. In 1935 the club won the New Forest Lads Cup. Within two years the Badgers moved to Oberfield and after World War 2 they spent some seasons at Tile Barn before moving to their current home at Grigg Lane in 1951.

The club were crowned Hampshire League Division Three champions in 1960 as well as winning the Bournemouth Seniors cup. They moved between the Second and Third divisions until in 1971 they were promoted to Division One where they won the league title in the 1975-76 season. Brockenhurst were founder members of the Wessex League, joining in 1986. The club's FA Cup giant killing reached its pinnacle in season 2001/02 when Kingstonian were defeated and in season 2004/05 the club reached the 3rd qualifying round, the run ending in defeat to Bath City.

In season 2012/13 the club returned to the Wessex Premier Division as Division One champions and reached the final of both the Southampton DFA Senior Cup and the Wessex League Cup. The Badgers won three cups in three years—in season 2019/20 the team won the Bournemouth Senior Cup; in 2020/21 we lifted the Hampshire Senior Invitational Supplementary Cup; and in 2021/22 we won the Russell-Cotes Cup. In 2020/21, both the U18 and U17 teams won their divisions. Season 2021/22 was one of the most successful for Brockenhurst in recent years, with the club finishing 6th in the Premier Division, getting to the last 16 in the FA Vase and winning the Russell-Cotes Cup. Brockenhurst celebrated its 125th season in 2023/24, and missed out on the promotion playoffs by goal difference only. At the end of the season, long-serving manager Pat McManus left the club; a successful and enjoyable testimonial match was held for Pat in July 2024.

We recently appointed Steve Devlin as first-team manager of Brockenhurst. We have retained the core of the squad from last year's campaign, and added experience, some returning players and a number of promising players. The future looks bright for The Badgers.

AFC STONEHAM CLUB HISZORY

The Club was founded in 1919 as the Royal Engineers (Ordnance Survey Office) FC by soldiers returning from the First World War, although there is a record of matches being played by Ordnance Survey Royal Engineers against The Gentlemen of Tenby in 1888. The club simplified its name in 1929 to Ordnance Survey.

The first team won the Premier Division of the Southampton Senior League in 1996/97. The Civil Service Ground was closed at the end of 98/99, and 'Survey' were temporarily relocated to Lordshill Recreation Ground before moving to their new home ground at Stoneham Park in 2002.

The club changed its name to Stoneham in 2006 and a year later decided to enhance the name by adding 'AFC' to Stoneham, which had an immediate effect with AFC Stoneham winning the Hampshire Premier League in the 2007/08 season and reaching the final of the league's Senior Cup.

In 2015, the Club earned promotion to the Wessex League. The first team ventured into the FA Vase for the first time in season 16/17, and beat two clubs from the Hellenic League, before losing to Shaftesbury.

Season 17/18 saw us improve our league position to 5th whilst reaching the final of the Russell-Cotes Cup, losing to Wessex Premier Division Champions Andover Town 1 -0 in the final at their ground in front of over 500 people.

During the 18/19 season, the first XI went 20 league games without defeat, one of only three teams at our level in the country to do so as we pushed for promotion to the Wessex Premier Division.

In the same season, for the first time in our 100-year history, we entered the FA Cup and had tremendous victories at AFC Portchester and at home against Westfield. Sadly, our adventure was curtailed by Cirencester Town in the next round at home in front of over 350 supporters. Prior to the Cirencester game, and as the lowest ranked team left in the competition, we had a visit from the FA Cup with many of our junior players and First Team present for photos on a memorable day which brought the club TV and national newspaper coverage. Our first ever FA Cup adventure will live in the memory for a very long time.

We finished the 18/19 season as Wessex Division One champions, securing promotion to the Wessex Premier Division.

Due to Covid-19, the 25/26 season will only be the club's fifth full season in the Wessex Premier Division, having finished third in 22/23, second in 23/24 but eventually succumbing to Shaftesbury in the play off final and second again in 24/25 but losing out in the play-off semi-final.

The club enter the 24/25 season with optimism and look forward to its adult and youth sections continuing their growth and progression.

LAST TIME OUT ...

JON RENYARD'S REVIEW OF BEMERTON HEATH HARLEQUINS V BROCKENHURST—25 OCTOBER 2025

The scorebook makes this sound like a pretty routine away win, and it probably was, but the Badgers contrived to make harder work of it than they should. The were largely dominant in the opening period, controlling possession and territory – their best chances on 7 minutes, Dunesby-Bent hammering his shot against the bar from an angle, and then on 18, a superb run from Torniainen, his piledriver of a shot spilled and running loose to McFarlane who placed his effort wide. Harleguins were relying on the long ball forward to Kapend, who worked hard for limited reward, but Brock seemed sure to break through soon... and at last, 27 minutes, Beale down the right and a deep cross headed powerfully back across goal and in by Connor Dunesby-Bent. It was the least the Badgers deserved at that point; Luke Holmes was running the game, ably supported by Toby Bailey, and the hosts hadn't gained a foothold. Until: 32 minutes, a deep free kick came through to Reynolds 8 yards out but it was past him in an instant, then a great run down the left by the energetic Wells, outpacing McFarlane and fizzing a cross through the six-yard box, missed by everyone... HT 0-1 Bemerton brought extra energy and extra bite at the start of the second period – not literally, perhaps, but certainly a level of physicality, some of it close to the edge and some of it beyond.
